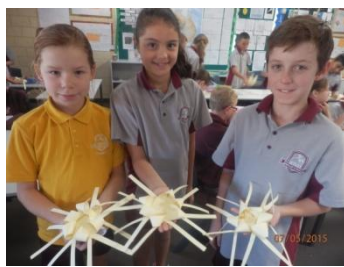


BALI CAME TO AVELEY PRIMARY SCHOOL, 2016
